
The crash remains under investigation.

#### **Haynes Dairy Wins Sullivan County Conservation Award**

CLAREMONT, NH--Every year, the Sullivan County Conservation District recognizes farms, organizations or individuals in Sullivan County that practice or promote the conservation of fertile soil, clean water, and other important natural resources. This year's award winners are John and Beth Haynes of Claremont, who together own and operate the Haynes Dairy Farm.

John and Beth Haynes are 3rd generation farmers. They purchased their 130 acre farm from John's parents in 1991. Committed to organic practices, the Haynes Dairy pastures their cows and uses rotational grazing to keep the fields healthy. Fertilizer for the fields comes almost entirely from the cows. Their Holstein herd is managed by focusing on preventative health, in which the animals are given good feed, fresh air and plenty of exercise. They also receive herbal supplements including echinacea, calendula, garlic and probiotics. The Haynes take pride in raising healthy, happy cows.

For 25 years, the Haynes Dairy has continually improved their family business. Conservation practices supported by the USDA NRCS

include the installation of an in-ground liquid manure tank that allows the capture and recycling of nutrients from the manure back onto the grasslands, a gravel pad for bale storage, creating a road network through the fields to minimize soil compaction and erosion during field operations, and transitioning all of the farm land and cattle to organic production. The Haynes Dairy has been certified Organic since 2007. Milk from the farm is sold to Organic Valley, which has recognized the Haynes Dairy with multiple Gold Awards for milk quality.

Thinking ahead, John and Beth Haynes are also in the process of completing an agricultural easement that will protect the agricultural and conservation values of their land for future farmers. Thanks to ongoing efforts by the Upper Valley Land Trust and the NRCS, the Haynes farm will soon be protected by an Agricultural Land Easement, ensuring that the pastures and soils John and Beth have managed so well will remain healthy and ready for the next generation.

The Haynes' will be presented with the 2016 Sullivan County Cooperator of the Year award at the NH Association of Conservation Districts

Annual Meeting banquet, which takes place on October 13th at the Common Man in Claremont. Tickets to the banquet may be purchased for \$20 until Friday, September 30th.
