Food Program for Children under the age of 18

On Monday, March 23 - The Claremont School District Food Program will begin the bus delivery of breakfast and lunch for students that are not able to get to one of our school buildings. Families have already been contacted and provided with a delivery time. If you are quarantined, please do not come out. We will leave you food outside for you to pick up after the delivery person leaves. For the safety of our staff and community, we have directed our staff to drive away if someone that is quarantined comes outside.

The Claremont School District Food Program will continue with the Mobile Food Stations located at each public school in Claremont. These Mobile Food Stations will be located at Bluff Elementary, Disnard Elementary, Maple Avenue Elementary, Claremont Middle School, and Stevens High School. These Mobile Food Stations will be open for breakfast from 8:00am to 9:30am and lunch 12:00pm to 1:30pm. You can pick up breakfast and lunch at whichever school is closest to your home. If you live next to Maple but go to school at SHS, you can get your meals at Maple.

During the 8:00am to 9:30am time frame, you can pick up both breakfast and lunch if you are unable to come back at the 12:00pm to 1:30pm time frame.

Please remember it is one breakfast and one lunch per child under the age of 18.

We have a number of vehicles that are getting a meal at one bus then going to another and another. This cannot occur. We want to make sure all of our students are receiving meals.

If students or parents can't access the Mobile Food Station and are in need of breakfast and/or lunch or any additional dietary requirements please call Pam Mley at 603.543.4290.

Remote Learning Process

Remote learning will begin on Monday, March 23, 2020. There should be no assignments due before this date.

Grade PreK-1 instructional materials will consist of instructional paper packets.

Grade 2-12 will be through either online opportunity (Google Classroom) and/or instructional paper packets.

Instructional material to be prepared will not be new instruction, but maintenance of already learned concepts and skills. We understand that not all courses are conducive to home/remote learning, especially over long periods of time. Teachers for these content areas (i.e. music, art, PE, health, CTE, etc) will be meeting to develop alternative plans and will communicate those with classroom teachers or families and students.

Teachers will monitor and document student work, including being available to students/families to answer questions, provide guidance and support home practice via Class Dojo, email, Google Classroom, etc.

Special Education Services

The Student Service Department wants to reassure our families of children with individualized educational programs (IEPs) that their children's learning needs will not go unmet during this period of time when we are implementing remote instruction. Our staff has been working diligently this past week to develop materials that can be implemented within each child's home. The materials being sent home are designed to provide each child with lessons that can assist in the maintenance of their skills. Our special educators and related service providers will continue to collaborate regularly with our regular education staff and our children's families. Collaboration may be achieved through online communication and/or telephone calls.

Some students will have the opportunity to receive their services via teletherapy. Case managers and related service providers will be reaching out to you about this if they haven't already. Additionally, many special education evaluations in process have been put on hold but IEP meetings and other special education meetings will continue to occur remotely.
